Luke 24:13-24, 30-31

On the road to Emmaus

¹³ Now that same day two of them were going to a village called Emmaus, about seven miles^[a] from

Jerusalem. ¹⁴ They were talking with each other about everything that had happened. ¹⁵ As they

talked and discussed these things with each other, Jesus himself came up and walked along with

them; ¹⁶ but they were kept from recognising him.

¹⁷ He asked them, 'What are you discussing together as you walk along?'

They stood still, their faces downcast. ¹⁸ One of them, named Cleopas, asked him, 'Are you the only

one visiting Jerusalem who does not know the things that have happened there in these days?'

19 'What things?' he asked.

'About Jesus of Nazareth,' they replied. 'He was a prophet, powerful in word and deed before God

and all the people. ²⁰ The chief priests and our rulers handed him over to be sentenced to death,

and they crucified him; ²¹ but we had hoped that he was the one who was going to redeem Israel.

And what is more, it is the third day since all this took place. ²² In addition, some of our women

amazed us. They went to the tomb early this morning 23 but didn't find his body. They came and

told us that they had seen a vision of angels, who said he was alive. ²⁴ Then some of our

companions went to the tomb and found it just as the women had said, but they did not see Jesus.'

³⁰ When he was at the table with them, he took bread, gave thanks, broke it and began to give it to

them. ³¹ Then their eyes were opened and they recognised him, and he disappeared from their

sight.

¹⁹ On the evening of that first day of the week, when the disciples were together, with the doors

locked for fear of the Jewish leaders, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with

you!' ²⁰ After he said this, he showed them his hands and side. The disciples were overjoyed when

they saw the Lord.

Jesus appears to Thomas

²⁴ Now Thomas (also known as Didymus^[a]), one of the Twelve, was not with the disciples when

Jesus came. ²⁵ So the other disciples told him, 'We have seen the Lord!'

But he said to them, 'Unless I see the nail marks in his hands and put my finger where the nails

were, and put my hand into his side, I will not believe.'

²⁶ A week later his disciples were in the house again, and Thomas was with them. Though the doors

were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you!' ²⁷ Then he said to

Thomas, 'Put your finger here; see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it into my side. Stop

doubting and believe.'

²⁸ Thomas said to him, 'My Lord and my God!'

²⁹ Then Jesus told him, 'Because you have seen me, you have believed; blessed are those who have

not seen and yet have believed.'
