

Praise 361 Forgiveness is your gift

Forgiveness is your gift, both cleansing and renewing, to catch us when we drift, our base desires pursuing; and hug us back to life and bring us to a feast where all will celebrate the life your love released.

Your grace goes out to meet the sinful and the doubting your arms and dancing feet speak louder than all shouting: O God, how great your love which takes us empty in, and, with our worth unproved let's better life begin. The Word of God: Isaiah 59:1-15, 19-20 59See, the LORD's hand is not too short to save,

nor his ear too dull to hear.

² Rather, your iniquities have been barriers

between you and your God, and your sins have hidden his face from you

so that he does not hear.

- ³ For your hands are defiled with blood, and your fingers with iniquity; your lips have spoken lies, your tongue mutters wickedness.
- ⁴ No one brings suit justly, no one goes to law honestly; they rely on empty pleas, they speak lies, conceiving mischief and begetting iniquity.
- ⁵ They hatch adders' eggs, and weave the spider's web; whoever eats their eggs dies, and the crushed egg hatches out a viper.
- ⁶ Their webs cannot serve as clothing; they cannot cover themselves with what they make.

Their works are works of iniquity, and deeds of violence are in their hands.

- ⁷ Their feet run to evil, and they rush to shed innocent blood; their thoughts are thoughts of iniquity, desolation and destruction are in their highways.
- 8 The way of peace they do not know, and there is no justice in their paths. Their roads they have made crooked; no one who walks in them knows peace.
- ⁹ Therefore justice is far from us, and righteousness does not reach us;

- we wait for light, and lo! there is darkness; and for brightness, but we walk in gloom.
- We grope like the blind along a wall, groping like those who have no eyes; we stumble at noon as in the twilight, among the vigorous as though we were dead.
- We all growl like bears; like doves we moan mournfully. We wait for justice, but there is none; for salvation, but it is far from us.
- ¹² For our transgressions before you are many,

and our sins testify against us.
Our transgressions indeed are with us,
and we know our iniquities:

¹³ transgressing, and denying the LORD, and turning away from following our God,

talking oppression and revolt, conceiving lying words and uttering them from the heart.

- Justice is turned back, and righteousness stands at a distance; for truth stumbles in the public square, and uprightness cannot enter.
- ¹⁵ Truth is lacking, and whoever turns from evil is despoiled.

¹⁷So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new! ¹⁸All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ, and has given us the ministry of reconciliation; ¹⁹that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting the message of reconciliation to us. ²⁰So we are ambassadors for Christ, since God is making his appeal through us; we entreat you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. ²¹For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.
